Band Notes: The Whitin Middle School's Intermediate and Advanced Bands marched in the Uxbridge Veterans' Day Parade on Sunday, November 9. Whitin students, Andrew Reardon and Lindsey Centrella delivered a speech on the Town Common.

Campaign 2008 in Grade 6: On Monday evening, November 3rd, two sixth grade Social Studies classes participated in a presidential debate and a mock election at Whitin Middle School. For two weeks, the students studied the candidates of Campaign 2008. Students were placed in the Democratic or Republican party and began their research of each candidate's views on five popular issues: education, energy, health care, the financial crisis, and the War in Iraq. The forty-four students invited families and friends to come in and watch them debate these issues. Presidential Candidates and their top aides answered questions and expressed their views on hot political questions. The students then escorted the audience members to Precinct 102 or Precinct 103 where they registered and voted in our mock election. Refreshments were served while we waited anxiously for the votes to be tallied. Barrack Obama won over John McCain by three votes. Congratulations to these bright and enthusiastic students for putting on such a magnificent show of knowledge and talent!

About the Flu...

What is the flu?

The flu is a very contagious disease of the respiratory system. It is easily passed from one person to another by coughing and sneezing. It usually can be very unpleasant but for most people symptoms get better after 7-10 days.

What are the signs and symptoms of the flu?

- Fever (sudden onset) 102-104 lasting 3-4 days
- Headache
- Muscle aches
- General weakness/extreme fatigue
- Accompanied by sore throat, dry cough ,runny/stuffy nose

What should you do if you have the flu?

- Rest in bed
- Drink fluids
- Take non-aspirin pain relievers (Tylenol, Advil or Motrin)
- Stay home until your symptoms have resolved
- See your health care provider if you are high risk for complications from the flu or if your symptoms worsen.

How can you protect yourself from the flu?

- **Wash your hands frequently**
- Cover your mouth when coughing or sneezing (never cough in the direction of someone else). If tissues are not available, cough or sneeze into the inside of your elbow. **Wash your hands.**
- Avoid close contact with anyone with flu symptoms.
- Stay home from work or school if you have symptoms of the flu.
- Do not share items that can spread germs.
- Clean things that are touched often (door handles, water faucets, etc.).
- Talk to your health care provider about receiving a flu shot.

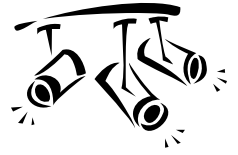
